

## Gleanings from local newspapers

#### Paris Daily Beacon, Jan 1892

Among the many deaths that have brought sadness into this community during the past few weeks, there is not one that has been occasion for more universal regret, than that of Elder G. M. **Rude**, which occurred shortly after midnight last night at his home in the western part of the city. The deceased was a native of New York, being born at Saratoga, Nov. 3rd, 1808, having therefore passed his eighty-third mile stone. At the age of twenty-eight, he entered the ministry, of the Christian denomination and his life thence forth was one of unswerving devotion of this chosen vocation. For eighteen years, he held a continuous charge at Harrison, Ohio, and thence removed to Indianapolis, where he engaged in evangelistic work. From that time forward, he preached the gospel "in season and out of season", working wherever his services were most needed, until failing health disabled him fro further activity in the pursuit of his profession. He removed to this city with his family in 1855 and has resided here ever since. He was married in 1832 to Miss Margaret **Gould**, of Dearborn county, Ind., who survives him. Of the eight children born of this union, five are still living, viz: W. B. **Rude** and Mrs. Jennie **Snyder** of Arcola; Mrs. Lida **Leitch**, Miss Emma **Rude** and F. M. **Rude**, of this city, all of whom have grown to manhood and womanhood, reflecting honor upon their parentage, and universally respected in the communities wherein they reside.

Mr. **Rude** was a Christian in all that the name implies. His devotion to the Master's cause was manifested not only in his active and fruitful ministerial labors, but in countless deeds of kindness which brought happiness into the lives of all around him. No appeal for sympathy or assistance was ever made to him in vain. He was charitable and just in all his dealings exemplifying in his own life the way in which he would guide the footsteps of others. He has been quite feeble for the past year and an attack of la grippe served to extinguish forever the lamp of life, which already burned with a dim uncertain light.

Funeral services will be conducted at the residence Wednesday, Jan. 20th at 10 o'clock a.m. Elder H. M .**Brooks** officiating.

#### The Paris Daily Beacon Tuesday 3 August 1909 on page 2

Mrs. Richeson Overcome Redmon, Ill. – August 3 – Mrs. Ethrall Richardson was so overcome with grief, attendant upon the death of husband, Sunday, that she suffered a severe nervous collapse today, and her condition is considered serious. Mrs. Richardson has not been very strong for years.

**Ethrail Richardson Dies Redmon, Ill. August 3** – Ethrail **Richardson** died at his home here of inflammation of the bowels, caused from a stroke of paralysis, sustained about two years ago. The deceased is survived by his widow and eight children. The funeral took place this morning at 10 o'clock from the family residence. Rev. **Hefner** of Humbolt officiating. Burial was made in the Embarrass Cemetery. [The above obituary has been copied just as it was printed.]

#### The Paris Daily Beacon Thursday 27 August 1914 – Front Page

Mrs. Richardson Dies at Redmon, Ill. – Widow of the late Ephriam Richardson Passes Away Mrs. Richardson Dies – Redmon, 27 August – Mrs. Elizabeth Richardson, widow of the late Ephraim Richardson, died at her home here on Wednesday, age 77 years. She was born in Guernsey County, Ohio, and came to Edgar County forty years ago. She was the mother of nine children, eight of whom survive, viz. Mrs. James Chesrown Jr. of Redmon; Mrs. Bertha Brill of St. Louis; Mrs. John Ryan of Hume; John of Isabell and Samuel Richardson of Kansas; Lewis Richardson of Cambridge, Oh; Elmer of Borton; and Ellsworth who lived at home.

The funeral will be conducted from the Embarrass Church at 10:30 o'clock Friday morning, Rev. W. D. **Russell**, of Bluff Springs, Ill. Officiating. Burial will be in the adjoining Cemetery.

## Gleanings from local newspapers

#### The Kansas Journal Thursday September 10, 1896

Probate Court.

The following is a record of the hearing and reports transacted in probate court during the past week.

C.C. **Clinton** as assignee was presented also the bond in the sum of \$5,000 by the assignee and an inventory of indebtedness, assets, etc., all of which were approved by the court.

Jas **Guyman**, administrator of the estate of John **Guyman** deceased, filed his bond for \$1,200 with Isaac **Trogdon** and Jas E **Fuqua** as sureties, which was approved. The appraisement bill showed personal property to the value of \$220.20.

Jas E **Fuqua**, T R **Hunter** and Isaac **Trogdon**, appraisers presented a report of appraisement in the estate of Nancy J **Rhoden** deceased, which was approved by the court.

John M **Noble** and I N **Cooley**, commissioners of the Brocton drainage district, filed their annual report of receipts and expenditures which was by the court examined and approved. Thursday Sept 24<sup>th</sup>, was fixed on as the day for hearing objections, should any be made to the report.

Andrew B **Ray** was appointed administrator of the estate of his sister, Laura **Ray** deceased. His bond was for \$3,000 with H **Van Sellar** and Hiram **Lycan** as sureties. The day of adjustment was set for first Monday in November. Appraisers: Geo **Ulrich**, Thos R **Hanks**, and Harry **Crowther**.

Susan C **Tinsley** was permitted to withdraw her claim of \$300 against the firm of **Ratts & Griffith** in the estate of Andrew J **Ratts**.

Abner B **Henry**, administrator of the estate of Wm B **Henry** deceased, made proof of publication for adjustment of claims as provided by law. The report was approved.

Wm A **Tweedy** filed his report of the sale of real property ordered in the estate of Ruth T **Ogburn**, deceased.

John and Robert **Hunter**, administrators of the estate of Wm **Hunter** deceased, filed proof of publication of final settlement and discharge which was approved.

Samuel **Redden**, executor of the last will and testament of the estate of Harvey **Redden** deceased, showed that the notice for the adjustment of claims against the estate had been erroneous and the first Monday in November was the time fixed for adjustment.

C C Clinton, assignee of W S Pinnell, filed his inventory of the estate which showed \$1,800 subject to \$1,000 mortgage and homestead rights; personal property, notes and accounts to the amount of \$3,366.91. Schedule of liabilities showed indebtedness to the amount of \$5,372.14, all of which was approved and the assignee was instructed to give at once the necessary notices required by law to the debtors and creditors of the insolvent and report.

Alfred **Devore** appeared in person and filed his petition praying that he be restored the possession of his real and personal estate and for the removal of his conservator, W H **Clinton**, the petition alleging complete information. Summons was directed to issue as required by law to the conservator, directed him to appear court and show cause why the prayer of the petition should not be granted. The hearing will be before a jury on Monday, Oct 5<sup>th</sup>, at 10 o'clock a m.

## Last Day of Service – Circuit Court Convenes Sept. 14th - Light Docket but Large Divorce Calendar.

Yesterday was the last day of service before the September term of the Edgar county circuit court which convines the 14<sup>th</sup> inst. Bailiffs were busy serving summonses all over the county and their labors did not end until midnight. The calendar is a light one and the cases are not of great importance as a rule. The divorce calendar proves an exception and is out of proportion to the cases under other departments. The tale of marital woe and domestic infidelity is graphically recited in the various bills which have been draughted and placed on file by the attorneys for the complainants. There are twenty-five petitions for divorce and a summary of those desiring legal separation, together with the charges against defendants, is here given as follows:

Deliena **Johnson** wants a divorce from Lester L. **Johnson**. The couple were wedded in Bloomington, Sept. 5, 1887. According to the bill Lester deserted his wife and lived with Rosa **Deshon** in January 1894. There is one child of seven years. The complainant asks a complete divorce, her maiden name, Dellena **Johnson** and the care and custody of her child.

Pearl **Hepner** asks a divorce from Marcus **Hepner**. The complainant charges drunkenness on the part of her husband and his failure to provide.

Ola **Mouser** is another who wishes a divorce from Zenas A. **Mouser**. The couple were married October 9, 1890. There is one child, Myrtle **Mouser**, age four years. The reason for the divorce is desertion on the part of the defendant.

James W. **Sutherland** vs. Kit, alias Anna L. **Sutherland**, is another case. The pair were wedded March 19, 1872. It is claimed that Anna deserted her husband sixteen years ago.

Mamie **Lowdenslager** vs. Oliver A. **Lowdenslager**, is one more case. The couple were married Jan. 28<sup>th</sup>, 1892. They had been married for only about three months, when the wife deserted. There is one child, age 3 years, which the husband wishes to have, claiming that the mother is not a suitable person to care for the daughter.

Benjamin F. **Lamb** wishes to be legally disjoined from the fulfillment of his marriage vows to Luella **Lamb**. The recitation in the bill is quite interesting. The complainant charges that he wedded Luella when he was only twenty-one years old while she claimed to be only 28 years old, but afterward admitted to being 33 years of age at the time of their marriage. The bill states that Luella was exceedingly chife to her young husband, would call him a boy and chastise him. There are two children.

Melissa **Taylor** vs. Oliver **Taylor** were wedded May 4<sup>th</sup>, 1873. There are seven children, the eldest daughter being married. The complainant charges that her husband deserted her over two years ago, since which time he has failed to provide for his family.

Wm. T. **Holt** vs. Emma L. **Holt** is another case of divorce. The complainant claims that the marriage was Feb. 28, 1889, but that his wife deserted his care and love on June 11, '94.

Rachel **Parkhurst** would be divorced from Jerome **Parkhurst**. The couple were married Oct 1<sup>st</sup>, 1880, in Jasper county. There are two children and the alleged grounds for divorce are attributed to drunkenness and cruelty on the part of the defendant.

Hattie **Baber** asks for a divorce from Frederick **Baber**. They were wedded in April 1895. The charge is repeated cruelty.

Alice **Sutton** sues for a divorce from George L. **Sutton**, the charge being desertion.

Rosetta Harrier vs. William Harrier is another case of divorce filed. The charge is drunkenness and cruelty.

Mary **Lambert** wishes a divorce from Earnest **Lambert**. The couple were married April 27, 1881, in Cincinnati and seven children have been born to them. The charge is extreme cruelty on the part of the defendant. The complainant asks for the care and custody of the children and means to sustain them.

James **Medough** wishes a divorce from Nancy J. **Medough**. The charge is adultery.

Harry Jacobs vs. Vida Jacobs;
Elmer Tiffin vs Kate Tiffin;
Jeminia Whalen vs C. C. Whalen.

Mamie **Draper** has filed suit against Harry L. **Draper** for separate maintenance.
