Family History Month

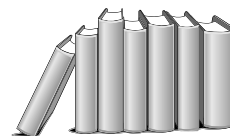

Edgar County Genealogy Library

Hello all! We are in the Dog Day of Summer and the County Fairs. The Air conditioner is on and we are keeping cool, so come on in and work on your genealogy.



Thank You - Volunteer Library Staff for your Dedication, we would not be able to keep our doors open three days a week and two Saturday per month without you. The small fees that we charge for research go to adding additional materials to the Library, as well as pay our utility bills: telephone, internet, rent, insurance, equipment maintenance, and supplies.

The Library is receiving questions via the web-site, we need to know three things: (surname and given name, time frame, and what you want searched.) We will not mail out information to you without payment. Some people promise to pay, but if we mail the information then we never receive payment. Please mail payment and a self-addressed envelope to the Library at the address provided.

If you are coming to visit the Library, some of the volunteers are back and other are new, and they bring new ideas and knowledge to the Library. You will also find that some people are working different shifts to cover the time slots.

A number of scrapbooks have been added to the shelves, which not only cover the current time frame but also earlier years. Some scrapbooks have been donated, copied and indexed. So check them out. We are also creating a database for all the scrapbooks, so only one search will be needed. At this time the database has over 100,000 entries, and added to each time a scrap- book is added and indexed.

Speaking of Scrapbooks, we have discovered a Misc. scrapbook (assigned the letters 'ML' is missing, it was last used on Thursday June 16th, if you accidentally carried it out of the building, please return it. We have had other patrons who need to copy a page or two from this book.

Help! If you have an obituary, a death cert. or Bible records for a relative and they were buried in Edgar Co. and are not listed in the Edgar County Cemetery Database. It can be added with a note that the information came from you. I just added another person to the database who passed away in 1913, from her obituary, which also tells us the cemetery she was laid to rest in.

If you Need Help getting started call The Library, our staff will provide one on one help, just call ahead and decide who you would like to work with. All the Volunteers have worked in genealogy and they know how to help.

Gleanings from Local Newspapers

Kansas Journal Thursday Feb 9th, 1956

Samuel H. Lanham, 69, Passes Away Tuesday - Samuel H. **Lanham**, 69 years of age, a farmer of the community south of Kansas for the past two years, passed away at this home Tuesday. His death was caused by heart disease.

The funeral was held in the Forbes-Hutchins funeral home at 2 o'clock this Thursday afternoon, with the Rev. John **McCord** Methodist minister, officiating. Interment was in Maple Hill cemetery at Westfield.

Mr. **Lanham** was born May 14, 1886 in Coles county, the son of James **Lanham** and Mary Martha **Skinner** Lanham. He had never married.

Surviving are one brother, Mark with whom he made his home and five sisters, Mrs. Frank **David**, Mrs. Sally **Merrick**, Westfield, Mrs. Stella **Bunch**, Charleston and Mrs. Susie **Scarbro**, Mattoon. [sic only 4 sisters listed]

Martin Sizemore, 89, Dies of Heart Attack – Martin **Sizemore**, 89 years old, residing on Kansas rural route No. 2 four miles southwest of Grandview, was found dead on the bedroom floor at his home Monday morning. Death is attributed to a heart attack during the night.

Coroner Harlan **Owen**, Chrisman, conducted an inquest Monday afternoon at a Paris funeral home.

Mr. **Sizemore** was born in Edgar county in 1866, son of John and Sarah **Aldrich Sizemore**. He was twice married, his first wife being Dovey **Shoemaker**, who died in 1897, and his second, the former Alice **Clapp**. Her death occurred in 1947.

Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Lula **Clark**, Little Rock, Ark., a brother, Edwin, and a sister, Mrs. Gertrude **Wright**, both residing with the deceased.

For a number of years Mr. **Sizemore** was a school teacher.

John Sexton Passes Away – Mrs. R. T. **Sexton** has received word of the death of John **Sexton**, a cousin of the late R. T. **Sexton**, Miss Bertha **Sexton** and Mrs. Roy **Bennett**. Mr. Sexton, a resident of Edwardsville, passed away Jan. 22.

Peter Austin Burba

The following information was extracted from the “*LaRue County Records*”, *A Quarterly Publication of the LaRue (KY) County Genealogy Society, No. 60*, which was written and submitted to the publication by Judy **Burba Cash**, resident of Edgar County, IL and librarian at the Edgar County Genealogy Library in Paris. Thank you Judy for your time and article on your Great-Grandfather.

Peter Austin **Burba** was born on March 1, 1837 in Hardin County. He was a son of M. **Burba** and Mary (**Hagan**) **Burba**. His mother was from Nelson County. His father was born in Ontario County, New York and his grandfather, Scammel **Burba** was born on March 3, 1786 in Cheshire, New Hampshire. Peter was 25 years old when he enrolled in the Union Army at Louisville. He enrolled on August 21, 1862 and was a private in Company I, 34th Ky. Infantry. He was described at enlistment as 6 ft. tall, blue eyes, light hair and light skin. Peter kept a diary during most of 1864 and a copy of it still survives in the possession of James D. LaRue.

Some of private Burba's duties in 1864 were as follows: working on fortifications; going to the mill to get corn ground into flour; picket duty; going for milk, beef and pork; on camp guard; cooking; shelling corn in camp; burying dead horses and soldiers; scout duty' getting logs to build guard houses; fishing; cleaning off a camp ground; building housing and a chimney. When Peter went for food, he would write that he went in the country for a beef. Sometimes he did not find food, even after being gone for at least one day. He even got lost one time in the mountains of eastern Tennessee searching for food.

On June 25, 1864 he received a letter from hat that evening saying his mother was dead. On Sunday, June 26th, he started home without permission and spent all night camped on the Cumberland River near a ford. On Monday, he traveled all day with a wagon train and spent the night near Barbourville. On Tuesday, he was still with the wagon train and he spent the night within ten miles of London, Kentucky. On Wednesday, he was still headed home with the train and left it near Camp Pitman walking to Rockcastle. On Thursday, the fifth day of his trip, he traveled from Rockcastle Ford to Crab Orchard and stayed all night in Stanford. Friday he traveled all day through Danville, Harrodsburg and Perryville. On the seventh day, he walked to Lebanon and took a “car” or train to New Haven and walked to Hodgenville and then home almost one week after he had learned of his precious mother's death. He spent the next eleven days at home and then began the long trip back to the Cumberland Gap on July 14, 1864. I assume he took a horse with him for the trip back took only five days, with him arriving on July 18th. He was then put under arrest for being absent without leave.

He notes in his diary that he was court marshaled at Cumberland Gap on November 7, 1864 and J. M. Richardson and C. F **Hornback** were his defense witnesses. He was forgiven and received an honorable discharge at Knoxville on June 24, 1865. Peter professes religion at an early age and joined the Oak Hill Baptist Church, where he was a member till his death.

Peter married Mary E. **Hornback** on February 18, 1858 in LaRue County. He and Mary had twelve children and eight preceded him in death. He was survived by his wife, three sons and a daughter. He departed this life on March 9, 1912 and is buried at Oak Hill Baptist Church.

Editors note: although we may not be a descendent of Peter A Burba, like Judy Cash, I think this article is great depiction of a soldier's daily life during the Civil War. Reading this, it's easy to picture my relatives doing the same work and struggling with the same problems as Peter did during his time of service.
